

Jasna Bastic is International Coordinator for International Students Exchange and Peace Education Programmes with Peace Boat, in Japan based organisation, www.peaceboat.org/english

She manages international educational and training programmes from its design, financial support, content and strategy framework, implementation, monitoring and evaluation. She organizes programmes for youth and student groups from the Balkans, Northern Ireland, the Middle East, India, Pakistan, Colombia, China, South Korea, Taiwan and Japan on: conflict analysis and non-violent conflict resolutions; conflict de-escalation, strategic thinking and project management; dialog and negotiation skills; facilitation and moderation skills, media trends. Also, she organizes field and study visits to the Balkans, the Middle East and Southeast Asia.

In particular, Jasna is working on student programmes in collaboration with the Tehran Peace Museum in Iran, whose activists and volunteers take part in Peace Boat voyages since 2013. She also manages programmes for MA students of Political Sciences (MA Peace Research and International Affairs), of the Tübingen University, Germany, and facilitated dialog sessions between Iranian, German and Japanese students.

She organizes programmes in ports of call visited by PB, public events, international forums and conferences, and moderates panels and public talks.

She graduated with a four year degree in Philosophy and Sociology, University of Sarajevo. Jasna was born in Sarajevo, Bosnia&Herzegovina, where she experienced war and the siege of Sarajevo. She was refugee in Switzerland, where she has been living since 1994. The war in ex-Yugoslavia, its roots and causes, post-war development and reconciliation process is regular theme in her seminars on Peace Boat.
